



High Plains District BALOO Training



(Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation)
Friday-Saturday, October 25-26, 2019
at Andover Central Park Lodge

- What is it?** BALOO is Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation. It is a one and one-half day course designed as an introduction to the Cub Scout outdoor program for leaders who are interested in adding and camping component to their Pack activities.
- Why?** Completion of this course is mandatory for at least one adult on a Pack overnigher, such as Webelos Woods or Camp Kanza summer overnight camps. Adding a well-executed camping component to a solid pack program increases interest and improves retention.
- Who?** CubMasters, Assistant CubMasters, Webelos Leaders, Den Leaders, other pack leaders, and parents
- When?** Friday-Saturday, October 25-26, 2019. Check-in is 4:00 – 4:30 pm on Friday. Closing ceremony ends at 9pm on Saturday.
- Where?** The Lodge at Andover Central Park, 1607 E Central Ave, Andover, KS 67002
- Cost?** **\$28 if paid on or before the early bird deadline of Friday October 11th, 2019.** An additional \$10 fee (\$38 total) will be added for registrations after 10/11/2019.
- Refunds?** Refunds are not available, but registration may be transferred to another participant.
- Registration?** **Pre-registration is required** in order for us to provide food and program materials to all participants. If the minimum number of participants (6) is not met, the event will be cancelled or rescheduled and registration fees refunded or applied to a future BALOO event. Registration is online only. The registration link may be found on the <http://www.quivira.org/training> webpage, under *Cub Scout Training*. Online payment is required and can be made by credit card or electronic check. **Registration will close on Friday, 10/18/19, at 5:00pm;** paper registration is NOT available.
- What to bring?** Scout Field Uniform (Scouts BSA themed T-shirts are acceptable), clothing commensurate to the weather, rain gear, tent, sleeping pad or cot and bedding, flash light, personal items kit, pocket knife, personal First Aid kit, camp chair, mess kit, a cup, a can-do attitude, and a smile. Also bring an idea for a song or skit for the concluding campfire program. A 100-page 3 ring binder (you may also purchase one at check-in) is recommended for materials and handouts that will be distributed during training. Please note that there are no shower facilities at the park.
- Included?** All meals (Friday night dinner, Saturday breakfast, lunch and dinner); Liability, Sickness and Accident insurance (must be a registered Scouts BSA member of Quivira Council); training manual to take home which includes camping program ideas, camp recipes appropriate for cubs, and more; Inspiration and know-how for developing a safe, fun, and effective camping program for your pack!
