



Boy Scouts of America
Preliminary Voting Report on Plan Confirmation
January 5, 2022

The Boy Scouts of America (BSA) has been working tirelessly to equitably compensate survivors and continue the mission of Scouting through its financial restructuring process. Quivira Council has closely monitored the events leading to the vote on the current Plan of Reorganization including the global settlement trust for abuse survivors. There have been reports that the restructuring plan was rejected by creditors including the abuse victims. However, the preliminary voting report shows significant support from survivors, with over 73% having voted in favor of the Plan. Of those survivors who cast individual ballots as opposed to being included in a master ballot filed by their attorneys, more than 85% support the plan.

Quivira Council and the National BSA are encouraged by these **preliminary results**. Quivira Council, through the Ad Hoc Committee of Local Councils, and the National BSA are actively engaging key parties to reach additional agreements to garner further support for the Plan before confirmation on February 22, 2022. The preliminary report issued today is not the final vote tally and does not forecast whether the court will approve or reject the Plan of Reorganization. While we would have preferred approval by more than 75% of all creditors including survivors, our work is not complete and further efforts are underway to sway more creditors to approve the plan.

Quivira Council will continue to deliver a Quality Scouting program to our families. Council Board members and staff are here to serve our units and districts in preparation for Spring and Summer activities while embracing the safest program through quality youth protection trained leadership.
